^bIn 2006-2007, by Faculty action, a new Education Studies curriculum was approved. EDS 200 and 300 were dropped and a new one-credit course, EDS 250 (which later changed to EDS 150), was added. EDS 150/250 must be taken by any student who did not complete EDS 200 or 300 by Spring Term 2006. The remaining courses in the new curriculum are listed above and will enable students to complete degree requirements within nine terms (without the additional Short Term previously required).

EDS 479 and 480 will have a 3-4 hour block daily practicum associated with them, time TBA.

^dOffered Fall Term only; must be taken in ninth term.

EDS 482 does not become a 3-credit course in BOND/Banner until the 2008/2009 academic year.

Notes: Majors must meet department standards for written and oral communication. Students also must meet the requirements for admission into the Teaching Education Program, and then into the Professional Term.

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
