Exploring the Minor—Students considering Business Administration as a minor should begin exploring the discipline through the Department’s introductory courses (BUS 120, ECO 101 or ECO 102) and through various Short Term offerings.

Course Sequencing Considerations (in order to complete minor requirements within eight terms)—Prospective Business Administration minors should complete or waive the Developmental Mathematics requirement as soon as possible because this is a prerequisite for BUS 120, ECO 101, and ECO 102. BUS 120 or ECO 102 is the prerequisite for BUS 315.
