

2009-2010 WOMEN'S STUDIES MINOR

(Minimum of five course credits)

Women's Studies is an important field of inquiry that arose from the effort to understand gender roles and women's historic struggle for justice throughout the world. The Women's Studies minor explores the diverse experiences, contributions, and perspectives of women, offers an interdisciplinary approach to the examination of the cultural construction of gender, and provides a feminist critique of dominant power relationships in the global community (familial, social, economic, and political). Women's Studies minors not only learn about women's experience from a variety of disciplines, but also can apply their knowledge directly in the framework of an internship or directed study.
