<b>Recent Accomplishments:</b>	Successfully fundraised and installed a solar panel on the Alumni Building. Currently planning to take a BC student delegation to the PowerShift conference and proposing real-time energy metering in all residence halls. Organized the Light Bulb Brigade (the changing out of incandescent light bulbs to fluorescent light bulbs in the dorms which will save Berea College over \$13,000 in the next four years), Coal display, EarthRoots festivities in April, Dorm Competition, Eco-Olympics, SEAC conference, and Mountain-top removal field trip, Southeast Renewable Energy Conference in Knoxville.

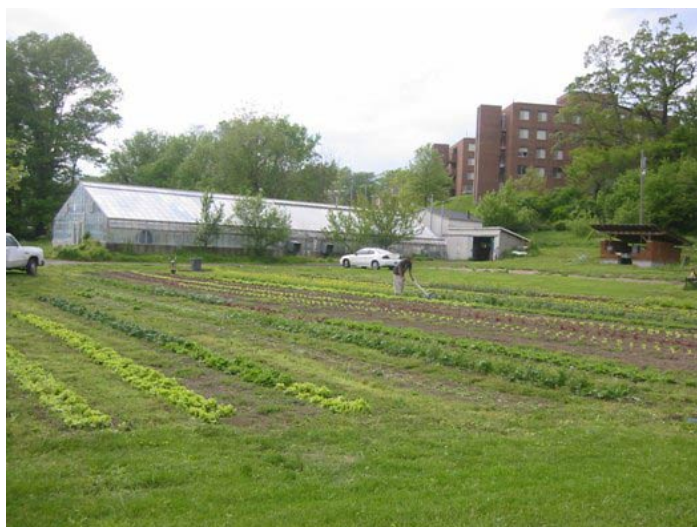

It also serves as a rich resource for the scholarly and creative work of faculty and students who have an interest in child development, family life, and teaching/ learning processes, and it serves the Appalachian Region by demonstrating exemplary services and by being a resource to other childcare and early education programs.

BCDS recycles cardboard, paper, aluminum, steel, tin and plastic; purchases meat and produce from the BC farms and other locally produced items when possible, and serves Fair Trade coffee in the dining hall and Crossroads Café.
<b>Recent Accomplishments:</b>	Began purchasing meat and produce from the college farms in 2006. Hired a sustainability coordinator in March 2007 to oversee recycling, composting, energy conservation, local food and student awareness efforts. Currently phasing out disposable packaging in favor of non-disposable serviceware in our catering operation. Crossroads Café is now collecting compostable waste, and using BC garden produce when available.
