

Partners for Education Summer Food Service Program

The Berea College Partners for Education Summer Camp is participating in the Summer Food Service Program (SFSP). Partners for Education has applied to the SFSP as a residential camp and is considered a closed site. Meals will be provided to all eligible Partners for Education Summer Camp participants free of charge. To be eligible to receive free meals at a residential or non-residential camp, children must meet the income guidelines for reduced-priced meals in the National School Lunch Program. The income guidelines for reduced-priced meals by family size are found online at <http://education.ky.gov/federal/SCN/Documents/2015-2016%20Income%20Eligibility%20Guidelines.pdf>. Children who are part of households that receive Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP, formerly foods stamps) benefits or benefits under the Food Distribution Program on Indian Reservations (FDPIR), or Temporary Assistance to Needy Families (TANF) are automatically eligible to receive free meals.

Acceptance and participation requirements for the Program and all activities are the same for all regardless of race, color, national origin, sex, age or disability, and there will be no discrimination in the course of the meal service. Meals will be provided at the sites and times as follows:
