We hope you are ready to register for another term at Berea. You will also receive instructions in addition to this Schedule of Classes via e-mail.

Please arrange to meet with your advisor between Monday, March 27, and Friday, April 7 to plan your schedule. You should include alternate courses in the event your preferred courses are not available at the time of registration.

COMPLETE THE FOLLOWING PROCEDURES IN THE ORDER GIVEN FOR REGISTRATION:

1. Contact your academic advisor for an appointment to plan your academic program.
2. You are expected to do preliminary planning of your schedule prior to your meeting with your advisor. Also, be prepared to discuss your future career plans and how you are currently progressing with your academic advisor. Please bring a copy of your degree audit (listed as Degree Evaluation) along with other relevant materials with you to the appointment with your advisor.
3. After your schedule(s) is completed, your advisor will give you an alternate PIN (which is a Personal Identification Number to use for registration only). This PIN is equivalent to the advisor's signature and indicates that the two of you have met and completed the schedule planning process. You will be asked for your Alternate Pin after you go in to the Registration screens. **Please take care not to misplace this important part of your registration information – only your advisor can give it to you again.** **The Office of the Registrar will not provide a student with their PIN during the initial registration period.**
4. Use your alternate PIN to begin your registration on myberea according to the schedule below. (You will not be able to register until your scheduled time.) The Web registration screens provide instructions on how to proceed with registration.
5. Please be aware that your labor contract for spring must be completed prior to registration.

## ORDER OF REGISTRATION

Registration day and time is determined by the number of credits you have earned (**does not include the credits for which you are currently enrolled**). Please check the menu on myBerea for the section "Check your Registration Status" to view your assigned time for registration. This will also give you access to see if you have any holds that would prevent your registration (Emergency Contact Information Update, Health Service, Financial Aid, Student Payroll, Student Accounts). Any holds will need to be cleared through the office that placed the hold on your record before you can register.

### CLOSED CLASSES, COURSE TIME CONFLICTS, PREREQUISITES

You will not be required to get the signature of your advisor if you encounter closed classes, have a course time conflict, or if you have problems with prerequisites. Instead, please contact the instructor of the course. If you are given permission to enroll in the course, that instructor will process the override and you would then register for the course by going back to the Web Registration.

### INTERNSHIP AND INDEPENDENT STUDY

To register for any 495 Internship, you must submit the appropriate application materials with required signatures to the Internship Office. Be sure you are aware of deadlines. The Internship Office will submit a list of the approved internships to the Office of the Registrar (116 Lincoln Hall) for registration processing.

### REGISTRATION PROCEDURES FOR APPLIED MUSIC (PRIVATE LESSONS)

You will sign up for these courses in the Music Building (Presser Hall) at the beginning of the Fall and Spring terms. The Registrar will register you for these courses once the list of students is complete.

### CHANGE OF PROGRAM (DROPPING/ADDING COURSES)

You will be permitted to drop-add, without fee, anytime between the time you register and Tuesday, August 29, 2017 by Web Registration. After these dates, you are not permitted to add a course. To withdraw from a course, you will need to process a change of registration form with your advisor's signature and take it to the Student Service Center in Lincoln Hall. Any course withdrawals after August 29, 2017 will be assigned a withdrawal grade and will be charged \$5.00 per form submitted to the Student Service Center.

### POLICY REGARDING COURSES DROPPED

Courses dropped during official registration periods or the first week of class of a regular term after classes begin will not be reflected on the permanent record. The letter "W" (withdrawn) will be used to indicate courses dropped during the second through fourth weeks of a regular term after classes begin.

You may withdraw from a course during the following four weeks and your instructor will be asked to indicate the quality of any completed work to that point with a "WP" (withdrawn passing) or a "WF" (withdrawn failing). No course may be dropped during the final seven weeks of the term. WF/WF will not be counted in calculating the GPA. (See calendar above for official drop/withdrawal dates.)

### TEACHER CERTIFICATION

Students planning to complete requirements for teacher certification must follow the guidelines given in "Program for Preparation for Teachers" in the Berea College Catalog.

### COURSE FEES

Course fees, shown in the SCHEDULE OF CLASSES and in the current BEREA COLLEGE CATALOG are charged to the student's account. The fee is automatically charged upon registration for the course. The student's account is credited if the course is dropped by the end of the first week of class as indicated in the official College calendar.

### SCHEDULE OF CLASS HOURS

Letters following course numbers (A,B,C, etc.) indicate sections of the same course. Letters attached to the course (i.e., 186A) indicate a specialized topic. The time of the class meeting is indicated by CLOCK hours, (e.g., 0800 is 8:00 am, 1000 for 10:00 am, 0100 for 1:00 p.m. The days of class meetings are indicated as follows: M=Monday, T=Tuesday, W=Wednesday, R=Thursday, F=Friday.

### CONVOCATION CREDIT

All students will automatically be enrolled in a .25 credit convocation course (CNV 100) during each of their regular terms of enrollment, with the exception of the final term of enrollment, for a maximum of eight such terms. For each term of enrollment in CNV 100, the student will earn a grade of CA (which is calculated as an A in the GPA) for attending at least seven convocations. The grade of CF (which is calculated as an F in the GPA) will be awarded for attendance at fewer than seven convocations. Enrollment in this course is optional during the final term at Berea (or is prohibited if the student has already enrolled in this course eight terms).

## IMPORTANT

Course Loads: The Maximum course credit load is 4.5 for all full-time students. Approval for course overload will be made by the Academic Advisor on a course registration form which should then be taken to the Student Service Center in Lincoln Hall. Overloads will be added to the student schedule the day before classes begin on August 22, 2017.

Underloads: For degree candidates, all class underloads (less than 3 credits) must have prior approval of the Student Admission and Academic Standing Committee. Requests for course underloads should be submitted to the Academic Services office (110 Lincoln Hall).

## SATISFACTORY ACADEMIC PROGRESS

Students will be placed on Academic Probation at the end of any regular term for failure to maintain a minimum 2.0 cumulative grade point average (GPA) or meet the credits requirement identified in the Satisfactory Academic Progress (SAP) chart listed in the College Catalog (<http://www.berea.edu/cataloghandbook>).

Students who are deficient in meeting the SAP requirements may make up the deficiency during the Summer Term at Berea College or another regionally accredited institution. If credit is to be earned elsewhere, permission must be secured from the Berea College Academic Records Analyst by completing the appropriate form, *Application for Transfer Credit*, available in the Student Self-Serve Room on the first floor of Lincoln Hall prior to enrollment.

## 2017 Special Topics Course Descriptions

AFR 186-The Black Male Freshman Experience: Providing Models and Mentors for Success- This college readiness course seeks to prepare African American male freshmen for the intellectual rigor and social challenges of academic life at Berea College. Through the interdisciplinary lens of African/African American Studies, students will learn strategies for success upon the campus of a predominantly White institution with a historic mission to serve both White and Black students within the Appalachian region. In addition to exposing young men to the broader significance of Black models of achievement in history, students will also learn about the enduring legacy of Black male educational attainment at Berea. Part of the mentorship focus of the course will involve introducing students to the successful educational and professional journeys of Black alumni. The course will explore such themes as identity, masculinity, spirituality, and time management. Course content will be delivered through scholarly essays, articles, documentaries, lectures and mentorship. Assessment of student learning will be achieved with the use of quizzes, journaling, a short expository essay, group and individual presentations, a community service project and course participation.

AFR/HIS 286- Readings in Moorish History- For nearly 8 centuries African Muslims known as “Moors,” resided within the borders of Christian Europe. Between 711-1492, the Moors intermarried with, governed, culturally influenced, and were eventually persecuted by their Catholic neighbors and kinfolk. Their primary historical association with Europe, when applied at all, is largely confined to the Iberian peninsula- today being the countries of Spain and Portugal. Yet, the legacy of the Moorish presence goes well beyond that of Iberia, extending into other European countries such as Britain, France, and Italy.

This course is intended to introduce students to the broad historical impact which the Moors had upon Western culture and European history. It will not only address the key areas of Moorish historical contributions, but also the highly revealing lessons of historiography. The fact that the Moors are customarily presented as “Arabs” in most Western historical treatments, rather than as the predominantly African (largely “Amazigh”) people which they were, is one of the areas which our course will assess.

Fortunately there has been an increase in the past decade or so, concerning the awareness of the favorable Moorish impact upon the rise of the sciences in the West, the university system, and Europe’s cultural ascension in general. Documentaries like those narrated by Dr. Bettany Hughes “When The Moors Ruled Europe” (2005) have brought greater light upon this period in European history, a period which is arguably as important in advancing European civilization as was that of the Greeks. This class will further the cause of this renewed consciousness by looking into the various aspects of the Moorish/African/Afro-Asiatic legacy.

ARH 186- Introduction to Archaeology- In this class, we will be using archaeology to examine culture; that is, how we go about adapting to the world. To better understand this adaptation as it occurred in the past and how it has changed over time and across space, archaeologists use material culture – the things constructed and manipulated by humans. In this class, we will explore how and why humans produce material culture, which have influenced human behavior, and how and why archaeologists investigate it.

COM 186- Radio Broadcasting- The purpose of Radio Broadcasting is to introduce students to the workings of the radio industry and to provide some introductory training and work in radio broadcasting. We will discuss the history of the medium and the broadcasting industry it created. We will also cover how a radio station is run and learn basic techniques in live audio production and broadcasting.

COM 286-Graphic Design- This course will provide students a basic overview of graphic design principles and production methods with an emphasis on graphic design as a career. Students will be guided through practical application of these principles and methods using industry standard software: Adobe Photoshop, Illustrator, and InDesign.

GST 186- Financial Literacy- This course will introduce fundamental concepts associated with basic money management, including time value of money concepts, household budgeting, financial decision-making with respect to job salary and benefits, mortgages, and investing.

HHP 286-Ultimate Frisbee- The purpose of this course is to familiarize students with the fundamentals of the game Ultimate Frisbee. This course that will be structured to address varying levels of ability and fitness. We will focus on the history and development of ultimate Frisbee rules and strategies for team competition. Field drills and exercises will be integrated throughout the unit to develop proper execution of all skills and techniques of the game.

HIS 386- Historical Anthropology- How do we know the past and understand the development of cultures? While the study of the past through written documentation has been the primary domain of history, it is not the only academic discipline concerned with past cultural events and processes. Biological, linguistic, archaeological and ethnological studies, central approaches within the discipline of anthropology, have also contributed significantly to exploring the past by examining material artifacts, textual records, and oral narratives. This course explores the disciplines of history and anthropology, as well as how these two disciplines have effected each other and created new methods of study including historical anthropology, anthropological history, ethnohistory, microhistory, history of mentalities and the “new” culture history.

Students in this course will explore several canonical texts at the interface of history and anthropology and will set upon the task of discerning what it means for historical research to operate within the domains of both the humanities and social sciences. How do anthropologists think differently about the past than scholars who define themselves as historians first? Core readings in this course will also explore how social scientists theorize such historical minutia as the contingency of process and event and how cultural memory and historical thought operate within and between cultures.

PSY 386- Clinical Neuropsychology- A neuropsychology course that looks at the touch, motor, and visual and spatial awareness systems in the brain, as well as the body position and balance senses, that create the brain’s “map” of the body and its location in space. Both normal functioning as well as disorders in functioning that result from brain damage and disease will be examined. Disorders will include anorexia, left-hemispatial neglect, phantom limbs, recognition disorders, etc. An emphasis will be placed on understanding neuroplasticity in the brain and how to best promote rehabilitation and recovery of function following brain damage.

SOC 286- Sociology of Health- This course is intended to introduce students to sociological perspectives on the study of health and illness in the context of the American health care system. The course will consider health, illness, sickness and disease as social phenomena. In particular we will examine ways in which health and ideas about health and its causation are shaped by social context, culture, social structure, and social processes. We consider the social organization of health care including health care occupations, the organization of the health care delivery system and related policy issues.

WGS/AFR 286- Exploring Sexualities: Portraits in Black and White-The title of this course highlights the constricted, binary, and often racialized ways in which people generally view sexuality. In this interdisciplinary course, we will use a critical, socio-historical lens to explore how binary thinking shapes our understanding of the diversity of human sexuality and how the socio-historical lens reveals the various ways that sexuality is socially constructed. This can be seen particularly in relation to the racialized conceptions of sexuality. For example, stereotypical beliefs about African peoples' sexualities persist and have been legitimized historically by various social institutions, such as the state, and academic fields, such as science, medicine, anthropology, and history. Likewise, the construction of whiteness also leads to various understandings of what might be considered "normal" or non-deviant sexuality. By deconstructing the discourses surrounding sexuality, we will learn to develop new ideas and insights into sexuality.

WGS/PSC 286- Women and Global Leadership- This course will introduce students to global issues that are especially pertinent to women. These issues include but are not limited to: gender-based violence and war; the promotion of global equality through the United Nations; challenges to education and healthcare; employment opportunities; and environmental risks. Students will learn how women around the world experience these various challenges as well as develop an understanding of how they can be leaders in their communities—whether local or global—to help mitigate these challenges to women.
